
Subject: Auditing Courses

1. Purpose

Students may be enrolled as auditors in courses, other than laboratory classes, if they have permission of their course advisors and class instructor.

The lecture portion of laboratory-linked courses and courses with computation periods may be designated as eligible for audit at the request of the course department head and on approval of the student's academic dean.

Auditors may not take an examination for credit later and may not transfer to regular status in a class after the last day to enter organized classes. Students may not be allowed to register for credit in any course previously audited.

The last date to change an AUDIT option is the last day to add classes.
